

### FROM THE PRESIDENT



TIM READ NATIONAL PRESIDENT

#### **Incorporation Process Finalised**

I wrote in this column last year that Sandra Alexander, our National Secretary Treasurer would be lodging an application with ASIC for the Society to become incorporated as a company limited by guarantee. I am happy to report that the application was successful and on 23 October 2019 ASIC gave its approval.

It is worth remembering that on 29 November 1933, 68 men who had been 20 years or more in the motion picture business sat down at Tattersall's Club in Sydney for the first meeting and dinner of what was then called "The Old Timers Club".

Now, 86 years later, the membership has grown from 68 to around 2,600, men and women both. There are branches in every State and Territory and many social activities are held. National and State Pioneers of the Year are honoured every year.

The benefits from this incorporation are principally that the Society is now able to take out Directors Insurance, removing the risk of

individual liability from Directors and all Society members, and the Society now has an ACN, making it easier to do business with our suppliers and key supporters. However the change does not affect the basically informal way the Society runs.

The only formal change is that the Society now has a Constitution which, together with any applicable ASIC regulations, defines the Society's objects and sets out its rules. The Constitution is accessible via the Society's website and Facebook pages. As previously, the Society is governed and managed by its Directors who serve on the National Executive Committee chaired by the National President. Additionally, each State Branch (two of which incorporate the Territories) has a President and committee.

The National Executive Committee consists of the National President, the National President Elect, the 6 State Branch Presidents, up to 10 former National Presidents and any elected additional directors.

And, there is now an Annual General Meeting for members which this year is being held on 28 November 2019 in Sydney. Notice of this meeting is included in this Bulletin and distributed in hard copy and by email.

As part of the Annual General meeting, the President gives a report on the Society's activities during the year. Also at the meeting, I will be reporting that the Society is in a sound financial state.

#### **National President Elect for 2020-2021**

At the National Executive Committee meeting 25 July 2019, Russell Anderson was elected National President Elect for 2020-2021.

Russell is a distinguished former Distribution executive, who won both the ICA and AIMC Lifetime Achievement Awards in 2015 and was the Society's Pioneer of the Year in 2018. Russell has already brought a wealth of ideas to the National Executive Committee meetings he has attended. One of these ideas, a proposal for

the Society to award a National Humanitarian Award was approved by the National Executive Committee on 25 July 2019. The inaugural winner of this Award, which will not necessarily be made every year, will be announced at the Anniversary Dinner.

#### **NEW MEMBERSHIPS**

Between 23 October 2018 and 30 June 2019, 80 new members joined the Society. And since 30 June 2019, a further 25 have joined indicating that new membership numbers are relatively steady by comparison with previous years.

Members are encouraged to remind friends and colleagues about the Society and suggest that those who are qualified should consider joining.

#### THE SOCIETY WEBSITE AND FACEBOOK PAGES

Activity on the Website and the National and State Facebook pages is increasing. At the end of July there had been 17,360 visits to the Website and 627 members are members of the Society's member only Facebook groups.

#### **ACTIVITIES**

The Society's principal object is "to facilitate, promote, and foster relationships and camaraderie, by means of Society Events, between persons who have provided sustained and committed service to the Australian Cinema/ Film industry". (Clause 4 of the Constitution)

Activities were held in all Branches during the year and the Anniversary Dinner in Sydney on Wednesday 14 November 2018 was attended by 170 members and guests.

#### CONCLUSION

The Society enters its new era as a company limited by guarantee at its inaugural Annual General Meeting in a sound financial position, committed to continuing the role of its predecessor but looking to the future.

I thank the Members of the NEC, the State Committees and particularly the National Secretary Treasurer, Sandra Alexander, for their hard work, leadership and dedication to the

With growth of this level the Society will continue to be a vibrant and exciting organisation.



### 2019 NATIONAL CINEMA PIONEER OF THE YEAR



Ron Reynolds 2019 National Cinema Pioneer of the Year



Ron Reynolds, at 12 years of age, starts his career as a lolly boy at the Victoria/Lyric and Theatre Royal Newcastle

Ron has had a career as a projectionist of 73 years and 9 months as at date of publication of this Bulletin. We are delighted to celebrate Ron as National Cinema Pioneer of the Year.

He has had a long and storied career serving at a number of the great cinemas of Australia. A Newcastle lad by birth, Ron started his career at the age of 12 as a lolly boy at the Victoria/Lyric and Theatre Royal Newcastle, and moved on to become Assistant Projectionist at Roxy Theatre Hamilton then to HOYTS Islington, Savoy New Lambton, Theatre Royal Newcastle, Civic Theatre, Victoria Theatre and Strand Theatre. In 1952 he was called up for National Service.

After his National Service at RAAF Amberley Signals Section he continued his career in Newcastle at the Theatre Royal and then later was made Projectionist at HOYTS Mayfield Theatre then sent to Tamworth Regent and

Capitol Theatres and Capitol Theatre Armidale as Relief Projectionist. Returning to the Newcastle area he joined MGM and became the Projectionist of the Metro Drive In Theatre in Gateshead, the largest in the southern hemisphere with a car capacity of 908 with a holding area of 720 cars.

After 11 years with Metro, Ron became a Manager at Grafton Drive In then he went back to Sydney as Manager of Forum Theatre, Barclay Theatre and Chullora Twin Drive In. He then joined Birch Carroll & Coyle as Manager of Keparra Drive In then Capalba Drive in which was the first Drive In to open in Queensland. After a few years Ron opened the New Capalba Drive In. Ron was then appointed Area Manager of Wide Bay, which included Crest Cinema & Drive In Bundaberg and Maryborough Theatre & Drive In. He was made Senior Manager of Gold

Coast Mermaid Cinema, Surfers Paradise Cinema, Sundale Cinema and Southport Drive In.

After a few years Ron went to the Northern Territory and opened the Casuarina Twin Cinemas, Darwin.

After a few more years HOYTS transferred Ron back to Sydney where he managed HOYTS Eastgardens and HOYTS Cinemas George

After a few more years Ron decided to retire but it only lasted three months when he found out that D&G Cinemas was about to open their four Cinema complex at Cronulla, he was then appointed Chief Projectionist.

After about seven years Ron went back to GU and was casual Projectionist at their George

St Cinema Complex. He then was Casual Projectionist at Roadshow Theatrette Darling Harbour, Universal Theatrette Darlinghurst, Universal Millers Point, Universal George St Sydney where he is still employed.

Ron served the industry as President of the Theatre Managers Association 2006-2007.

It is rare, if not unprecedented to encounter someone who has served our industry for 73+ years. Ron's career as a projectionist is emblematic of those thousands who toiled for decades as the heart and soul of their cinemas. There can be few roles as closely identified with the magic of cinema than that of the projectionist.

Honouring Ron honours all projectionists. Their role in the legacy of cinema is undeniable.

#### BERYL MADSEN - 2019 QUEENSLAND CINEMA PIONEER OF THE YEAR

Beryl's career began in Maryborough in 1963 as a cafe attendant at the Starline Drive-in. The job suited Beryl down to the ground, working nights while her husband looked after the four kids. Beryl progressed to ticket seller and then Assistant Manager.

Following Jack Craig-Gardner's death in 1973 Beryl was appointed Manager of the Wintergarden Cinema and Starline Drive-In. Beryl was the first female in the Management team at BCC Cinemas.

Beryl cherishes the memory of meeting both Edward and Daniel Carroll during their trip to the nearby town of Howard where they had gone to school and their father was the local policeman.

The Wintergarden Cinema hosted several stars of stage and screen including Jan Michael Vincent (World's Greatest Athlete), Jack Thompson (Sunday Too Far Away) and Susannah York and Tim Burstall AM (Eliza Fraser). Beryl also hosted The Drifters, Slim Dusty and Chad Morgan at live shows. One of Beryl's greatest career highlights was receiving a personal telegram from Paul Hogan following a record-breaking season of Crocodile Dundee at the Cinema Maroochydore.

During her time at the **Starline Drive-in** a young bloke (Alan Rydge) and his mate arrived in a Jeep covered in cooking utensils and looking pretty untidy and asked if they could see a movie for free! Not knowing him from a bar of soap Beryl refused but soon realised he was the son of Sir Norman Rydge, the Chairman of the Company!

The final screening at the Wintergarden Cinema saw a packed house for a double feature of Phar Lap and Man from Snowy River.

Birch Carroll and Coyle sold both theatres in Maryborough in 1983 and Beryl became manager of the Maroochydore Cinema and **Drive-In** and in 1984 she became the manager, and the new BCC Maroochydore Cinema 6 opened in the Sunshine Plaza creating another opportunity for Beryl.

Beryl's career has been blessed with loyal and hardworking staff many of whom are now Pioneers in their own right - wonderful General Managers, Mr Morley, Terry Jackman, John Smith and Richard Parton.

Beryl managed the BCC Maroochydore Cinema 6 until her retirement and sadly called it a day with family commitments and the travel bug demanding her attention.

Beryl still lives in Maroochydore where she has regular catch ups with past BCC staff in between travelling the world.

#### **KEVIN ADAMS - 2019 VICTORIAN CINEMA PIONEER OF THE YEAR**



#### **KEVIN ADAMS** A LIFETIME IN CINEMA

Kevin is deeply humbled by this recognition. His involvement in the Industry spans 40 years and counting.

Still in High School, he worked weekends at the Progress Theatre in West Coburg, and spent time in the bio-box at HOYTS Altona Drive-In. Leaving school he became an Assistant Projectionist at the Australia Twin in the city, later working as the Film Booker/Despatch Clerk for Greg Lynch Film Distributors during the day, and ushering in the city at the Roma Cinema at night.

He then shifted interstate to work as the Projectionist at the Wagga Plaza before returning to work in Victoria at the Astor at Ararat, followed by the Regal in Benalla. He then became Manager/Operator at the Wangaratta Drive-In Theatre for many years, and during this time was also involved in re-opening the Drive-Ins at Yarrawonga and Albury as well as assisting at other theatres in the region. He was involved in the opening of the Wangaratta Cinema Centre before moving to Swan Hill to open the Oasis Twin Cinemas.

In 1998 he became a full-time Projectionist for the opening of the new Melbourne IMAX Theatre -and is still on hand there 21 years later. Kevin also worked for George Florence at the iconic Astor Theatre in St.Kilda, often playing the piano before running the projectors! He also did additional shifts for Palace Cinemas at their Westgarth Theatre and this year returned to work for them running both 35/70mm shows at the Astor which they now operate.

Kevin has been a past State President of the Victorian branch, still serving on the committee as well as serving the entire Society as our National Social Media/Webmaster operating our website and 7 Facebook groups.

His passion for recording Australian cinema history began in his teens and he has amassed a massive database of photos and information. This came in handy as a past Editor of CinemaRecord Magazine for The Cinema & Theatre Historical Society of Australia – and is now utilised in his own popular Facebook group "The Cinemas & Theatres of Australia" – a group that has spurred Kevin on to work on producing a book of the same name. A lifetime in Cinema – and a lifetime love of it.

#### JOHN ROCHESTER - 2019 NSW CINEMA PIONEER OF THE YEAR

John Rochester commenced his career as a Chartered Accountant in the commercial sector with Email and became Financial Controller of their Consumer Products Division.

John commenced with HOYTS Theatres Limited in 1975 and in 1976 was appointed Chief Financial Officer and Company Secretary. He was appointed General Manager Theatre Operations and in 1980 was appointed to the Board of HOYTS, then owned by Twentieth Century Fox.

In 1982 he joined The Greater Union Organisation and was later appointed Chief General Manager of the Group. During this time the Industry saw the extraordinary boom of the Multiplex Cinemas. John also represented Greater Union as a Member of the Boards of Village Theatres Limited in Victoria and Birch Carroll & Coyle Limited in Queensland.

In 1987 John was invited to re-join HOYTS, as President and CEO of HOYTS's International Operations in the United States, overseeing their expansion to be one of the top 10 exhibition circuits in the U.S.A. After amalgamation of the four circuits HOYTS had acquired, building 150 new screens and the development of the U.S. management team, John returned to Australia in 1990 as Managing Director of HOYTS Entertainment Limited, to oversee the restructure of the HOYTS' Public Group.

In 1995 John was appointed the CEO of Reading Australia Pty Ltd, to take responsibility for the setting up of Reading Entertainment. Following the establishment of the Reading Group, John joined IMAX Theatres Limited in 1999 as Managing Director.

John continued as an Industry consultant, including a three-year assignment in a diverse group of Media, Entertainment and Property Companies. During that time John also served The Australian Cinema Pioneers as National President in 2008 and is a continuing Member of the National Executive Committee.

Since retiring from full time working commitments in 2011, John has maintained a close connection with the Industry increasing his commitment to The Australian Cinema Pioneers serving as New South Wales Branch President for the past four years.

John also continues his involvement with The Motion Picture Industry Benevolent Society as a Joint Patron, Councillor and Chairman Of Finance.

#### MARLENE GREGORY - 2019 SOUTH AUSTRALIAN CINEMA PIONEER OF THE YEAR

Marlene Gregory (nee Shaw) began her lifelong love of the film industry in 1958 as an usherette at Greater Union's Majestic Theatre in Launceston, Tasmania. She later transferred to the ticket box/booking office which was located in rather cramped conditions between two sets of marble stairs.

Marlene relocated to Adelaide in 1961 and commenced work in John Martin's Theatre Booking Office where she processed bookings for selected city theatres- Clifford Theatre Circuit along with many live concerts including The Beatles, Michael Edgley's Great Moscow Circus, Adelaide Festival of Arts and many other productions.

Whilst working at John Martin's, Marlene met Trevor Gregory and their first date was to see West Side Story, still one of their favourite films. They married in 1965 and settled in Adelaide to raise their family.

In 1967 Marlene received a call from Greater Union's State Manager, Jim Begg, to work in their Treasury Office. This led to working as a ticket seller at Wests Theatre, State Theatre and Sturt Cinema on some major films – Bridge on The River Kwai /Lawrence of Arabia/Eddie Duchin Story / Cat Ballou and Picnic.


With a young family Marlene sought casual work at HOYTS and worked at Regent and Midcity Cinemas with Managers, Ted Winter, Rex Vincent, Ian Strain and John Cronin. Her love of the Regent Theatre led her to volunteer as programme seller at the closing night performance of the original Regent in 1967 and again in 2004 when the re-modelled Regent Cinemas closed. At HOYTS Regent Cinemas Marlene worked on several blockbuster movies including Star Wars series/ many of the 007 Bond movies / Close Encounters of The Third Kind /Rocky movies / Gandhi/ Man From Snowy River/Phar Lap and Crocodile Dundee.

Marlene has spent many hours volunteering for many film industry groups including: Annual Movie Ball Committees, SA MPI Provident Fund, MEAA (HOYTS Representative), HOYTS Regent Reunion Committee, MPI Club of SA (Current President), and Co-ordinator of Annual Academy Awards SA Luncheons.

Marlene's lifetime dedication and loyalty to the SA Motion Picture Industry has been outstanding, and is now recognised with her being awarded the 2019 South Australian Cinema Pioneer of the Year.

#### ROY MUDGE - WESTERN AUSTRALIAN 2019 CINEMA PIONEER OF THE YEAR

Roy Mudge commenced in the WA Cinema Industry after leaving John Curtin High School in 1963. Starting as an assistant projectionist with City Theatres at the Princess Theatre in Fremantle, before transferring across town to the Oriana Cinema where he learnt his craft for the next fifteen months. In June 1965 Roy moved into Perth City to the Piccadilly Theatre and then The Grand and finally Theatre Royal, where he remained for ten months screening *My Fair Lady* on 70mm doing two shows per day.

In 1967, a promotion to Operator saw him move back to the Princess Theatre and again then the Oriana. In 1972, he became assistant manager at the Piccadilly and then Manager of the Grand Theatre in 1973.

In 1975 Roy travelled to the UK working as an assistant manager at the Odeon Marble Arch in London. Upon his return to Perth a year later, he was appointed Chief Projectionist at the newly

opened Port Cinema, Fremantle and became manager there in 1980.

Between 1982 – 1988, Roy ran his own cinemas and drive-ins through regional WA before returning to Fremantle working for Coastal Cinemas (now HOYTS) as Chief Projectionist, where he remained for 21 years before retiring after a 50-year career in 2012.

In retirement, Roy has used his time to continue promoting the history and social significance of the cinema industry particularly in Western Australia. In his capacity as curator of the Sunset AMMPT Museum he weekly supervises the activities of volunteers involved in the acquisition, conservation and display of cinema and television equipment and memorabilia. Roy is also Vice President of the National Body of AMMPT and Programs the Classics of the Silver Screen. He is a regular guest speaker for Probus clubs and the University of the Third Age groups, always promoting our great industry.



## A STORY ABOUT AUSTRALIA'S CINEMA PIONEERS



A critique by respected Australian cinema historian and previously a senior curator at the National Film & Sound Archives, Graham Shirley writes;

Nitrate Nomads is an important contribution to Australian film history not only for telling the story of Allan Jones and other showmen in the South-West of Western Australia, but also for setting that story in a regional, national and international context.


